The Theater Was Frank C. Leaming's Calling

In 1880 at the age of twenty-five, Frank was an unemployed member of a theatrical group¹ and twenty years later he still recorded his occupation as - theater.² In about 1884 he married Ida E. (unknown) and they had two sons, Thomas Corwin, born March 26, 1885 and Harry James Leaming, born March 7, 1888. Harry died as an infant³ and Thomas predeceased both his parents in 1918.⁴

By 1900 Frank and Ida had settled in Lexington, Kentucky and for many years lived in a boarding house. Evidently the theater proved not to be a reliable source of income, for in 1910 Frank was employed as a foreman for a printing firm.⁵ At the time of Frank's death September 18, 1920 he was a proof reader for a newspaper, and instead of being a boarder, he and Ida were operating a boarding house in Lexington.⁶ Ida died in February 1923. Frank, Ida and their sons were buried in a William Hibben lot in Sugar Grove Cemetery, Wilmington, Ohio.⁷

Caroline Leaming And Addison Jobe Were Wed In Yellow Springs, Ohio

Caroline (aka Carrie) spent her youth in Wilmington, Ohio. In 1874 her family moved to nearby Yellow Springs. There she married Addison Jobe on October 17, 1877. The Census of 1880 reveals that Addison's father, Allen, and Carrie's granduncle, William Hibben lived in nearby households and that Addison had joined his father's trade - wagon making.⁸ By 1900 Addison and Carrie had eight children and at that time Addison was employed as a engineer in a powder mill.⁹

Carrie died January 21, 1910 in Yellow Springs at the age of 52..

Caroline H. Leaming Jobe was born at Wilmington, O., May 19, 1857, and died in Yellow Springs, O., Jan. 21st, 1910, aged 52 years, 8 months, 2 days. She was the only daughter living of Ephraim T. Leaming and Eliza Woodruff Leaming, several sisters and brothers having died in infancy. She passed the early years of her girlhood at Wilmington. The family came to Yellow Springs to reside when she was seventeen years of age. On Oct.. 17, 1877 she was united in marriage to Addison A. Jobe. Of this union eight children were born, seven girls and one boy - all living. Two married daughters, Mrs. Gertrude Baker of Osborn, Mrs. Florence Thornton of Yellow Springs, and the other members of the family, Elsie, Ruth, Hazel, Mildred, Bernice and Emmett, together with her husband, survive her. Mrs. Jobe also leaves four brothers - Frank C. Leaming of Elmira, N. Y.; Charles A. Leaming of Urbana. O., Edward J. Leaming of Porto Rico (sic); the youngest brother, Robert, whose residence is unknown, and one half-brother, Samuel A. Leaming of Cincinnati, O. She had been ill for many months of an incurable disease, but bore her sufferings, which were at times intense, patiently and bravely, until death came to relieve her. She was ever a loving and self-sacrificing mother, doing her duty as best she knew how. "Life's sorrows are ended, Earth's troubles are o'er; She has gone to her Savior To suffer no more." Funeral services conducted by Rev. Patton of the M. E. Church were held at the home on High Street, on Sunday ... interment was at the Glenn Forest cemetery.¹⁰

After Carrie's death Addison moved to Dayton, Ohio where he lived with his daughter, Gertrude, until he died August 1, 1927.

Addison A. Jobe, son of Allen and Asserreth Berry Jobe, passed away at his home in Dayton on Monday, A.M. August 1st. Mr. Jobe was born in Belmont county, Ohio, April 24, 1852. He came with his parents to Yellow Springs, when a child and spent most of his life here. After the death of his wife, who before marriage was Miss Carrie Leaming, he moved to Dayton where he made his home with his daughter. Brief funeral services were held at his home at 2 P. M. Wednesday, and interment was made in Glen Forest cemetery, Yellow Springs.¹¹

Additional Information About The Children Of Addison And Carrie Jobe

Seven daughters and one son were born in Yellow Springs to Addison and Carrie Jobe . Emmett Jobe, their only son was born August 2, 1891. When about twenty, he contracted tuberculosis and died on March 13, 1914.¹²

Emmet Jobe, son of Addison Jobe, died at the Tuberculosis Hospital in Springfield, on Thursday. He has been in failing health for some time and has spent some time at the Mt. Vernon Hospital before going to one in Clark County. The funeral will be held this afternoon from Littleton's undertaking establishment.¹³

Gertrude L. Jobe was their eldest daughter. She was born about 1879. On November 26, 1902 she married Bert A. Baker who was a rural mail carrier. They did not have children.

Bert A. Baker, age 26 a resident of Osborn, Greene Co., OH; Born Osborn, son of Silas Baker and Clara Oagland, To Gertrude L. Jobe, age 24, resident and born in Yellow Springs, Greene Co., OH, Married by Rev. Peters, applied on 26 Nov. 1902.¹⁴

After Bert's death on January 25, 1918 of pneumonia,¹⁵ Gertrude took a factory job. She continued to support herself. She was listed in the US Census of 1930 as a machine operator, as was her sister Ruth, with whom Gertrude was living near Dayton.¹⁶ She died June 16, 1954 at a hospital in Dayton.

*Services for Mrs. Gertrude Baker, 75, of 131 Buckeye St., Dayton, formerly of Yellow Springs, will be held at 10:30 a. m. Monday at Morris Sons' Funeral Home, Dayton. Burial will be in Fairfield Cemetery. . Mrs. Baker died at 6:15 a. m. Friday in College Hill Hospital, Dayton. A native of Yellow Springs, she had lived in Dayton 30 years and had also lived in old Osborn. Surviving Mrs. Baker are three sisters, Mrs. Frank Haehnel and Mrs. Mildred Jobe of Chicago and Mrs. Bernice Roche of Springfield.*¹⁷

Elsie Jobe was born December 5, 1880. In 1900, at the age of 19, Elsie was a student living with her parents in Yellow Springs.¹⁸ Apparently, she was epileptic and institutionalized while a young woman. She is not recorded in subsequent census reports, however, her death certificate reveals that on June 21, 1949, at the age of 68, she died at the Gallipolis State Institute in Gallipolis, Ohio of "exhaustion from epileptic dementia." The report indicates Elsie had been an epileptic for forty-seven years and had never married. No family informant was listed. Hospital records provided the vital statistics.¹⁹

Ruth Jobe was born July 1, 1883. She, also, never married. Census reports through 1920 indicate she lived with her parents and did not have an occupation.²⁰ After the death of her father in 1927 she lived with her sister near Dayton and took a job as a machine operator in a factory.²¹ At the age of 70, Ruth died November 25, 1953. Her sister, Gertrude, was the informant for her death certificate.²²

Hazel K. Jobe was born in June 1885. At the age of 28, she married Frank K. Haehnel. They moved to Chicago, Illinois where their four children were born: Caroline born June 28, 1915; Marshall born September 10, 1919; and Frank W. born September 19, 1922. Frank K. Haehnel worked as a stationary engineer in factories.²³ He died in 1962 and Hazel about 1967.

*Aug.. 8, 1962: Frank K. Haehnel, beloved husband of Hazel, nee Jobe; loving father of Caroline (Thomas) Hardman, Marshall, and Frank W. (Jewell); dear brother of William, Ella Russell, Max and the late Louisa and Fred; fond grandfather of four. . Interment Elmwood Park.*²⁴

Florence Jobe was the fifth daughter of Addison and Caroline Jobe. She was born October 7, 1887. About 1907 she married Claude R. Thornton, a musician in the theatrical business according to the Census of 1910.²⁵ There is no record that they had children. In 1920 Florence was living with her father near Dayton, Ohio, without Claude.²⁶ Her sister, Gertrude, was the informant of her death certificate which reveals that Florence was hospitalized with tuberculosis for over two years before her death October 3, 1923.²⁷

Mildred Jobe was born January 20, 1894.²⁸ The US Census reports of 1920 and 1930 record that she was single and in 1930 was a servant for a private family in Oakwood Village, Montgomery County, OH.²⁹ The only other record found of Mildred is the Social Security Death Index which states that she died in February 1987 in Illinois.³⁰

The youngest daughter of Addison and Caroline Jobe was Bernice A. Jobe who was born June 12, 1896.³¹ In 1910, after her mother had died, Bernice lived with her uncle Charles A. Leaming's family in Urbana, Ohio.³² In about 1917 she married Edmund C. Bennett and was living in Springfield, Clark County, Ohio in 1920 with her husband and daughter Dolores. Edmund was a 'tire finisher' at the Victor Rubber Company.³³ They had two more children: Gertrude A. born about 1920 and Edmund A. Bennett born December 21, 1921. Edmund died of Hodgkin's disease October 10, 1922.³⁴ Several years later Bernice married Edward M. Roche on July 29, 1924 in Clark County, Ohio.³⁵ The US Census of 1930 records that Edward and Bernice had two children: Patricia M. born about 1925 and James P. Roche born October 4, 1929. Also, Bernice's three children from her first marriage were living with their mother and stepfather.³⁶ Edward died March 1, 1949.³⁷

*Edward M. Roche, 67, died in his home, 425 N. Jackson St., at 8:35 a. m. Tuesday after a short illness. He was a member of St. Mary [Catholic] Church. Surviving are the widow, Bernice; daughter, Mrs. Patricia Pellin, Springfield; son, James in the Marine Corps, Puerto Rico; two step-daughters, Mrs. Dolores Laveck, Springfield, and Gertrude Bennett, Hamilton; step-son, Edmund Bennett with the U. S. Army in Tokyo; two sisters, Mrs. Mary Reagan and Mrs. Alice Dalie, both of Springfield. . .*³⁸

Bernice survived Edward by twenty-six years. She died in Springfield on March 5, 1977 at the age of 80.³⁹



Charles A. Leaming Becomes A Grocer

Charles Adkinson Leaming was born in Wilmington, Clinton County, Ohio on March 31, 1861.⁴⁰ He was the fifth child of Ephraim and Eliza Leaming and was a teenager when his family moved from Wilmington to Yellow Springs, Greene County, Ohio. There he met and married Mary Clifford Sroufe on September 24, 1883.⁴¹ The 1880 Census⁴² records that, as a young man, he was a house painter, but his obituaries state that after his marriage he was the proprietor of a grocery store in Springfield, Ohio. Subsequently, he continued in the grocery business in Urbana and Bellefontaine, Ohio.⁴³

Three of Charles And Mary's Five Children Die

Charles and Mary had five children, all born in Springfield, Clark County, Ohio. The first was stillborn in 1884.⁴⁴ Four boys followed: John Conklin Leaming was born November 6, 1885; Charles Clifford Leaming, September 11, 1888;⁴⁵ Hugh Leaming, May 5, 1893;⁴⁶ and George Fullerton Leaming, October 29, 1895. George died of pneumonia on April 24, 1907, at the age of eleven.⁴⁷

LADS LAY THEIR PLAYMATE TO REST, Tender Tribute To George Fullerton Leaming Who Was Called By Death — Presbyterian Boys' Brigade Adopts Suitable Resolutions — Burial in Springfield.

At a meeting of the Presbyterian Boys' Brigade held last night, the following resolutions were unanimously adopted:

"Whereas, Death, for the first time in the history of our brigade, has invaded our ranks and taken from us George Fullerton Leaming; and

“Whereas, he was one of the most faithful, active and regular in attendance, members of the brigade;

“Therefore, be it resolved that while we deeply mourn our loss, we submissively bow to the will of the Great Commander of all, and shall ever cherish in memory his virtue, manly bearing and noble qualities of mind and heart.

“Resolved, that we hereby extend to the parents and brothers of the deceased in this their hour of greatest grief, the sincere sympathy of the brigade, both collectively and individually.

“Resolved, that we attend his funeral in a body and in full dress uniform.

“Resolved, that these resolutions be spread upon our minutes and be published in the city daily papers and a copy thereof be sent to the parents of the deceased.”⁴⁸

John Leaming died August 6, 1913, at the relatively young age of twenty-seven.⁴⁹ John Conklin Leaming was born in Springfield on November 6th, 1885 and came to Urbana in 1897. He graduated from the Urbana High School in 1904 and then entered Miami University at Oxford, where he pursued his studies during '04, '05, and '06. In 1906 while at Miami he was stricken with the illness that soon developed into tuberculosis and he went to Arizona where he spent two years in quest of health. He took up newspaper work and showed unusual talent from the start. . . His health had gradually declined however and when he came back from the west in 1910 it was recognized by his family and friends that the battle for health was a hopeless one. His strong vitality and his courageous grip on life bore him up, however, and the last months of his life were spent with his parents and among the associates and scenes he loved so well. . .⁵⁰

Charles And Mary Are Buried Beside Their Children

What little information known about Charles A. Leaming has been found in his obituaries. He was still employed, but had been afflicted with diabetes for some time, when he died on January 18, 1925.⁵¹

Charles A. Leaming, 64, a prominent Urbana businessman, died about 3:30 a m, today at his home 220 W. Ward st, after a week's illness. His death was due to complications of diseases and was hastened by blood poisoning from an ingrown hair on his chin.

He was born in Wilmington and for a number of years conducted a grocery store in Springfield. For a number of years he was in the grocery business in Urbana. At the time of his death he was employed by the F. N. Johnson Wholesale Grocery Co. of Bellefontaine.

He was a member of the Masonic Order, the United Commercial Travelers and an elder in the Presbyterian Church. He leaves a wife and two sons. Hugh and Charles, Jr., both of Michigan and several grandchildren.”⁵²

Mary survived Charles by sixteen years, dying on December 30, 1941, at the age of eighty-two.⁵³

Mrs. Mary C. Leaming, 82, former Urbana resident and widow of the late C. A. Leaming died Tuesday at 6:51 a.m., in Rickley Hospital at the Ohio Masonic Homme, Springfield, where she had been a patient for five weeks.

Mrs. Leaming was born December 18, 1859 in Yellow Springs. Death was the result of infirmities incident to her age. Mr. Leaming well known business man of Urbana preceded his wife in death a number of years ago and for one and a half years Mrs. Leaming had made her home in Springfield with her son Charles and wife.

Some of the family had resided in Urbana since 1896 until Mrs. Leaming moved to Springfield, and surviving Mrs. Leaming are two sons Hugh, Rochester, N. Y., and Charles, Springfield.⁵⁴

Additional Information About Sons, Hugh And Charles Clifford Leaming

Hugh Leaming married Cecilia L. Kinney on March 28, 1916, in Grosse Pointe, Michigan. They had one daughter, Virginia Bell Leaming, born June 2, 1917,⁵⁵ who married Herbert Wisley Duerr on March 30, 1940.⁵⁶

Hugh Leaming died in May of 1965, in Florida. His wife, Cecilia, died November 22, 1991, in Mt. Dora, Florida.⁵⁷ Virginia Bell Duerr died in December 1983, in Las Vegas, New Mexico. Her husband, Herbert, died there also, in July 1984.⁵⁸

Charles C. Leaming married Lacy Pearl Hitchcock on January 4, 1917, in Detroit, Michigan. He served in the infantry during World War I. Charles and Lacy had one son, John Clifford Leaming, born June 22, 1930, who married Priscilla Jean Cochrane on September 16, 1950.

Charles died December 26, 1957, in Detroit. His wife, Lacy, died February 10, 1975 in Saginaw, Michigan.⁵⁹
