Jennie's Early Life

Jennie Ann Woodruff, born September 24, 1863, was seven years old when her mother, Sarah Elizabeth Woodruff, remarried. She was raised by William Hibben and Sarah. Jennie was recorded twice in the 1880 Census, once as Jennie Hibben in Yellow Springs, Greene County, Ohio¹ and again as Jennie Woodruff in Union Township, Clinton County, Ohio.² She spent some time in the summer of 1880 “*assisting keeping house*” for her grandmother, Ann Maria McLain.

Jennie Marries A Paper Mill Worker

In about 1888 Jennie married Frank B. Barringer. They had four children. William W. Barringer, June 18, 1889³ and Franklin C. Barringer, April 7, 1891 were born in Ohio.⁴ Mary Elizabeth Barringer, May 19, 1893⁵ and Edith A. Barringer, in June 1896 were born in Wabash, Wabash County, Indiana.⁶ Frank held a ‘paper finisher’ position in Wabash for over ten years. He later returned to Yellow springs where he held the same position in the Oxford Miami Paper Company. All of his children, except Edith, also worked in the paper mills. William was a ‘cutter man,’ and Mary was a ‘cutter girl.’ Franklin was a ‘printer’ and Edith was recorded in the 1920 Census as a ‘telephone operator.’⁷

Jennie Barringer died February 11, 1929.

*Mrs. Jennie W. Barringer, 66, wife of Frank B. Barringer and a former resident of Yellow Springs, died at her home in West Carrollton, Monday morning after a long illness.*⁸

*Barringer - Mrs. Frank of West Carrollton on Monday. She is survived by her husband and four children, William, Frank, Mary and Mrs. Edith Milburg. . . . Burial will be in Glendale cemetery, Yellow Springs.*⁹

*Mrs. Jennie W. Barringer, 66, died at her home on E. Central Ave., early Monday morning. Mrs. Barringer was the wife of Frank B. Barringer, a finisher in the Oxford Miami Paper Co., where he has been employed for over 20 years.*¹⁰

During his last years, Frank lived with his daughter Mary. He died October 28, 1943. He was buried beside Jennie in Glen Forest Cemetery, Yellow Springs, Ohio.¹¹

Frank B. Barringer, 81 of Dayton, died Thursday at 12:15 at the home of his daughter, Mary Dickerson of Brookville. Born in Enon, O., he lived in West Carrollton for many years before moving to Dayton. Surviving besides the daughter are another daughter, Mrs. Edith Milborn of Dayton, two sons; Frank and William Barringer; four grandchildren; and two sisters, Mrs. Bessie Yenish and Mrs. Mollie Porter, both of Springfield. Funeral services will be held at the Milburn home, 417 N. Woodward ave. at a time to be announced. Burial will be in the Yellow Springs cemetery.¹²

Burial of Frank B. Barringer, 81, Dayton, who died at the home of a daughter, Mrs. Mary Dickerson, Brookville, Thursday, was made in Glen Forest Cemetery, Yellow Springs, Saturday afternoon following services at the home of another daughter, Mrs. Edith Milburn, Dayton.¹³

Additional Information About Jennie And Frank's Children

Mary Barringer married Clinton C. Dickerson. Clinton died July 9, 1952, in Dayton. Mary died in December, 14 1980, at the age of eighty-seven, at her residence in Brookville, Montgomery County, Ohio.¹⁴

Edith was recorded in the 1920 Census as being divorced. She later married Robert A. Milburn. She died in 1967.¹⁵

At the time of Jennie's death, her son, William, was living in Detroit and son, Franklin, in Dayton. William was a veteran of World War I and a printer by trade. He died at the Veterans Administration Hospital in Dayton on August 2, 1975, at the age of eighty-six.¹⁶ No other documentation about these children has been found.



William Woodruff Settles In Colorado

William Hibben Woodruff was the last child born to Joseph Oliver Woodruff and Sarah Elizabeth Stucker. He was born in Wilmington, Clinton County, Ohio on February 8, 1866, five months before his father died. His life is chronicled by Census reports from 1870¹⁷ through 1930. He was living with his mother and stepfather, William Hibben, at the time of the 1880 Census.¹⁸ In 1881, when still a teenager, he moved to Colorado to live with his aunt and uncle, Lyda/Lida and Loren Dye.¹⁹ He worked in the old David Denslow Ryus store on Main Street for a number of years.

Mr. Ryus sold his store out to Dad [William Hibben Woodruff] and J. K. Kincade [Kincaid]. This was around 1890—Dad was a young go getter, hard worker and when William Hibben [William's stepfather] died [1889] there was a settlement of the estate and Dad got his share and put it into real estate, along Main Street. Really built half the town. Sold his share in the store to J. K. Kincade [Kincaid] when he was appointed postmaster. He owned the post office building, the drug store built out of native stone with the lodge hall above. He was the master of the lodge, owned the bakery shop and two [three] blocks from Main Street West, he built a nice home on two acres of land. J. K. Kincade [Kincaid], or Joe as most people called him, had a nice home across the street. Both had nice horses for their own use and as a kid we had just about everything that [we] could want.

*Kincades [Kincaids] and Woodruffs were the rich people of the little town of LaVeta.*²⁰

In 1890 William married Ella May Arnold.²¹ Ella was the daughter of May Arnold, a widow with six children, who came from Kansas to Colorado in a covered wagon, about 1873.²² The 1900 Census²³ records William as post master of La Veta, Colorado, and at that time Ella May and he had three children: William Ray Woodruff, born November 23, 1892; Jenevieve Velma Woodruff, born April 1896; and Kenneth D. Woodruff, born May 1900.²⁴ By 1910 two more boys had been born; Olin Woodruff in 1902 and Lynn Woodruff on May 15, 1908. William continued to serve as the post master of La Veta.²⁵

*The Ryus-Kincaid store stood on the corner of Ryus and Main Streets and next door, on Main, stood W. H.'s home, a small frame affair. W. H. owned three stone business houses. They still stand. His home was moved to make way for construction. W. H.'s original store, The Profit-Sharing Cash Store, sold musical instruments, clocks, jewelry, hardware and confectionery. In addition, he was postmaster and in the post office was a book store with candies, fruit, nuts and stationery. His finest edifice was the two-story bakery building and I see here the bakery was built by Loren Dye. This building burned down about 1916 and was replaced by a one-story. The bakery room on the rear of the building was destroyed but the walls still stand. The building is now La Veta Town Hall.*²⁶

Ella became ill and her medical expenses strained the family resources.

*My grandmother, Ella May was sick. I don't know what was wrong with her but they thought she would be better in a lower altitude. My grandfather, William Hibben Woodruff, sold every thing in LaVeta. They first went to San Diego which is where his half sister Lyda (Hibben) Martin was living. They worked their way up the coast until they arrived in Eugene, Oregon. My grandmother, Ella May, seemed to feel better so they stayed. They bought a small farm in Eugene, Oregon. My father, William Ray Woodruff did not go with the family to the West Coast. He was a young man by this time and had a job with the railroad. The other three boys Kenneth D., Olin, and Lynn were with the family in Eugene, Oregon as well as grandson Jack Calvert.*²⁷

Ella May Dies And William Remarries

The change in climate was not a remedy. Ella May died on December 27, 1915, in Eugene, Lane Co., Oregon.²⁸ William and his three sons, Kenneth, Olin and Lynn, returned to Walsenburg. William married again, in August 1917, to Kate Elizabeth (Keener) Kessler, a school teacher in Walsenburg. They had a son, Harold Delmar Woodruff, born March 26, 1919.²⁹ By then William was recorded as the manager of a general store, and Kate as the Assistant Post Master at Solar, Colorado. William was ten years older than Kate, whose first husband, Edward Kessler, had been killed during the Huerfano and Las Animas County coal miners strike and armed conflict in 1914.

As dawn lightened the sky, Harris spotted 'a bunch of men coming over the hill'—Brown and his miners—forming a skirmish line. The guards rushed to ready the machine gun; Watson fired off two shots with his rifle, a prearranged signal that trouble was brewing. . . .Gus Whitney was in the mule barn when the warning

shots drew him into the dirt street, where he joined Jack Smith and a few other men from the camp. Smith asked where they could find cover. 'I says the best place I know of how to get out of it is under that old rock house, across the arroyo.' The men ran, bullets whizzing past, some finding their mark. Smith and Edward 'Abe' Kessler, a carpenter, fell to the dirt mortally wounded as the others dove into the stone house.³⁰

Edward had fallen victim to a labor conflict where East Coast money (Rockefeller) collided with immigrant poverty and need. Kate and Edward had two daughters, Leola and Dorothy. After Edward's death Kate attended a normal school to prepare for a teaching career which she pursued for almost fifty years. Sometime before William's death, William and Kate were divorced. William died in December 1932 in Walsenburg, Colorado and was buried in the Masonic Cemetery.³¹ About 1935, Kate went into the Indian service to teach on the Navajo reservation. In 1956 she was transferred from a reservation post to Albuquerque, New Mexico. Kate lived most of her later life with her daughter, Leola, who also was a teacher. Kate died February 2, 1967, in Albuquerque, New Mexico just two days short of her ninetieth birthday.³² She was buried at the Fairmount Cemetery, Denver, Colorado next to her first husband, Edward Kessler.³³

Additional Information About The Children of William H. Woodruff

William Ray Woodruff, known as Ray, was first married in August 1917 to Hazel May Burch. This marriage ended in divorce and on March 9, 1922, Ray married Loretta Marie Pellegrini in Raton, New Mexico. Loretta was born in Cansano, Italy on February 29, 1904 and was the daughter of Nicholas Pellegrini and Maria Morelli. Ray and Loretta had one son, Kenneth Oliver Woodruff, born in April 1923 in Walsenburg, Colorado. Ray worked for a time mining coal at Mutual, Colorado and after passing the Postal Service exam, became a mail carrier. Ray died as a result of a self-inflicted gun shot on May 22, 1940, in Walsenburg, Colorado.³⁴ He is buried in the Masonic Cemetery.³⁵ Loretta remarried in about 1945 to Clifford Kemp and they had two children. Loretta died May 17, 1979, in Portland, Oregon.

Velma Woodruff gave birth to Arthur S. Calvert's son John (Jack) Calvert four days before her fifteenth birthday. Shortly thereafter, it is believed that Velma and son Jack moved to Oregon with her parents, leaving Arthur behind. About 1913 Velma married Walter Scott Dodge. His 1918 World War I draft registration form claims Velma Dodge as his nearest relative,³⁶ and the Census of 1920 records Walter and Velma with the girls, Violet and Ruby Dodge, as their daughters.³⁷ Sometime after 1920 Velma married William M. Matson. The Census of 1930 records the girls as William's nieces.³⁸ Velma's death certificate stated she had been a resident of Oregon before settling in Arizona six years prior to her death and was the wife of William Matson. She died February 20, 1973 and was buried at Greenwood Cemetery, Phoenix, Arizona.³⁹

KD [Kenneth D. Woodruff] went into the Navy. He enlisted in Trinidad, Colorado. My grandfather wanted him to prepare himself and try to go to the Naval Academy at Annapolis. He had to lie about his age to get into the Navy. He was, according to my Aunt Jo [Josephine Pelligrini Woodruff], only 16 years old. KD made the Navy a career and finally retired with 20 years in the Navy at

*the age of 36. He was a Chief Torpedo man on the submarine named Nautilus. Towards the end of his military career he was stationed at San Diego. During this period of time he homesteaded the 50 acres of land near Ramona, California. My aunt still lives on this 50 acres. One of her sons and several grandchildren also have homes on the 50 acres.*⁴⁰

Kenneth D. Woodruff married Josephine Elizabeth Pelligrini on May 26, 1928 in Trinidad, Colorado.⁴¹ They had two sons: Milton D. Woodruff, born March 15, 1929; and Raymond Woodruff, born September 13, 1931.⁴²

*As I understand it, KD joined the Navy before they [William H. Woodruff and Kate Kessler] were married, right about the time the U. S. entered World War I. According to my grandmother [Loretta Pelligrini Woodruff], KD had asked permission to write to her [Josephine Pelligrini] when he was home on leave one time when she was about 15. She already knew him because her sister (Loretta) was married to KD's brother. They became, in effect, pen pals. KD came home on leave again about the time she graduated from high school, and as she put it, he told her they were getting married. She said it all happened quite fast, and within a week she was married and on her way to Hawaii where KD was stationed.*⁴³

Kenneth D. Woodruff died July 30, 1983 at the Navy Hospital in San Diego, California. Josephine lived on the Woodruff homestead until January 6, 2004 when she died at the age of ninety-four. (Note: Andrew William Woodruff, grandson of Kenneth D. Woodruff, has researched and shared information about William H. Woodruff and his descendants.)

Olin Oliver Woodruff married Mildred Mathis in April 1926. They had two sons. William was born in August 1927 and Donald Edward Woodruff was born May 29, 1929. Donald died in when a teenager in an auto accident and William was killed in action in Korea in July 1950. The loss of his boys was devastating to Olin. Shortly after a family reunion in August 1967, Olin died of a self-inflicted gun shot wound.⁴⁴ He is buried in Mt. View Cemetery, Casa Grande, Arizona. No information has been found concerning Mildred.

Lynn Woodruff married Marion Bernice Smith Uhl in November 1928 in La Veta, Colorado. Their children were Jack Elbert Woodruff born March 30, 1930 and Marilyn Woodruff born October 9, 1931. Marilyn died of a brain tumor at the Mayo Clinic in 1935. Shortly thereafter, Lynn and Marion were divorced. About 1938 Lynn married Edith Richeson and they had two children, Loretta Joyce Woodruff and Earl Clifford Woodruff. Lynn died June 23, 1943, and is buried at Oak Hill Cemetery, Eugene, Lane County, Oregon. Marion and her son, Jack, both died in 2004 in Arkansas. Edith died August 27, 2007 in Gladstone, OR.
