Amelia (a.k.a. Milly) Lydia Hibben, first child of Harry Cobb Hibben and Lena Hartman was born June 21, 1884 in St. Paul, Minnesota. (Plate 12) She was 15 years old when recorded in the US Census 1900 living in Flagstaff.<sup>2</sup> Just two years later in July 1902 she married Charles Henry Corey who was born in Rollo, Phelps County, Missouri in 1876.<sup>3</sup> Milly and Charles homesteaded on a ranch in Fort Valley outside of Flagstaff. They had three boys:<sup>4</sup> Steven Dennis Corey, born November 3, 1903; Charles Harry Corey, born August 18, 1909; and William Stacey Corey, born November 7, 1911.

Milly and Charles separated and on October 23, 1934 she married John Haner from Kansas. The marriage is recorded in Charles Henry Corey's diary: *1934 Oct 23. Mrs. Chas. H. Corey & John Haner married at Gallup, N. Mex. Ages; Corey 49, Haner 22.*<sup>5</sup> This was a short lived union. Then in the spring of 1945 Milly married Charles Sparks. Charles died within the year of prostate cancer. She did not marry again.

In 1958, with her brother Stacy, she attended a pioneers reunion in Flagstaff.

*MANY OLDTIMERS AT PIONEER FETE Twenty-nine members of the Northern Branch of the Arizona Pioneer's Historical Society that staged its annual reunion here Labor Day arrived in Arizona or were born in the state before 1900. . . arrivals before the turn of the century who attended were. . . Milley Corey Sparks ('90) of Flagstaff; Stacy Hibben ('90) of Camp Verde; . . .*<sup>6</sup>

Local news columns of *The Arizona Daily Sun* reveal that while a widow for thirty years, Milly frequently welcomed siblings and her children to her Flagstaff home and made return visits to Grand Canyon, Phoenix, Needles, and Camp Verde.<sup>7</sup> Her cooking, gardening and handicraft hobbies were the feature of another 1958 newspaper article.

*MRS. WILLIE [MILLY] SPARKS RECOMMENDS RECIPE FOR HOLIDAY PLUM PUDDING Among Mrs. Millie [Milly] Sparks' many hobbies is cooking, and her friends agree she is a good cook. This time of the year, many of them comment that she makes the BEST plum pudding. Mrs. Sparks came to Flagstaff with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Harry Hibben, when she was six years old, and has lived here since that time. Her father, one of Flagstaff's pioneers, served as county recorder for many years, and Mrs. Sparks worked 'off and on' in the court house since she was a young lady. Mrs. Sparks was born in St. Paul, Minn., and the family lived in California a year before coming to Flagstaff. Her first husband, Charles Corey, was engaged in ranching north of Flagstaff on the Ft. Valley Road. Mrs. Sparks is the mother of three son, William of Flagstaff; Steven D. of California; and Charles of Durango, Colo. She has eight grandchildren and five great grandchildren. She is a member of the Rebekah Lodge and is active in the Service Mothers Club, assisting in the club project of preparing cancer dressings and other projects. She also belongs to the Order of Eastern Star, the American Legion Auxiliary, the Pioneers Historical Society and the Senior Citizens Club. In addition to cooking, her hobbies include growing flowers in her yard in the summer time, and raising house plants. She especially likes to grow philodendron and has 'a whole house full' of philodendron plants. Another hobby is handwork, especially embroidery and crochet. Traditionally, members of the Service Mothers Club hold their annual Christmas party at Mrs. Sparks' home. This year, however, her health does not permit her to be hostess at the party.*<sup>8</sup>

Milly's tombstone in Citizens Cemetery, Flagstaff is inscribed: "Milly Hibben Corey Sparks, June 21, 1884 - July 8, 1975."

*MILLY L. SPARKS, 91 Services for Milly Lydia Sparks, 91, who homesteaded in Fort Valley in 1904, will be Friday at 2:30 p. m. at First Christian Church in Flagstaff. . . .Burial will be in a family plot in Masonic Cemetery, with Order of Eastern Star performing graveside services. Mrs. Sparks was born June 21, 1884 in St. Paul, Minn. She homesteaded Fort Valley with her husband, C. H. Corey, Sr., in 1904. She moved to a Phoenix nursing home in 1973. She was a member of the Pioneer Historical Society. She died Tuesday. Survivors include sons S. B. Corey of Needles, Calif., C. H. Corey, Jr., of Durango, Colo., and William S. Corey of Cave Creek; a sister, Katherine Hart of Phoenix; a brother, Stacy Hibben of Camp Verde; seven grandchildren and a number of great grandchildren.<sup>9</sup>*

Charles Henry Corey died January 31, 1958 in Sepulveda, California.<sup>10</sup>

### **Additional Information About The Children of Milly and Charles Corey**

Steven Dennis Corey married Louise Tetzlaff. In 1957 he was employed by the Merritt Electric Company of Flagstaff. He died in nearby Needles, California in December 1980.

Charles Harry Corey married Maxina Ellalee Mecham, daughter of Leonidas 'Lee' Maroni Mecham and Jessie Bernice Petterson November 3, 1928 in Flagstaff. Their six children were born in Arizona. Later Charles and Maxina move to Durango, Colorado where he was associated with Vanadium Corporation of America. Charles died February 12, 1990<sup>11</sup> and Maxina passed on March 24, 2007,<sup>12</sup> both at Durango.



Stacy Barcroft Hibben was born January 31, 1886 in St. Paul, Minnesota. (Plate 12) He was 19 and living in Flagstaff, Arizona when he married Maud Hallie Harrell in April 5, 1905. "Daddy was 19 and it [the marriage certificate] says my mother was 17 while in fact I believe she was 16. In those years before we [daughters, Adalynlee and Annette] came along, they were separated and my mother attended Georgia Wesleyan College in Macon. My mother's mother died in Phoenix in 1911 and that perhaps brought them back together."<sup>13</sup> Adalynlee Valerie Hibben and Annette Harrell Hibben were born in Needles, California.<sup>14</sup> Two other infant siblings, Jack and Arden, died shortly after birth in 1917 and 1918, respectively. In 1921 Stacy and Maud were divorced. At an unknown later date Stacy married Sophia Edith Rihn. Edith, as she was known, died November 29, 1975 at Camp Verde, Arizona.

*EDITH S. HIBBEN, 83 Camp Verde -- Edith S. Hibben, 83, died Saturday in her home at Camp Verde. Mrs. Hibben was a retired school teacher and Registered Nurse and had graduated from Michael Reese Hospital in Chicago, Ill. She had lived in Camp Verde 16 years and came to Arizona from Oklahoma in 1930. She was a member of the Diamond chapter #7 of Order of Eastern Star, Cottonwood, and also a member of the First Baptist Church, Camp Verde. She is survived by her widower, Stacy Hibben and four sisters, Mabel Ottel of Phoenix, Mrs. Fay Kloffenstein, Mrs. Florence Bogard, and Mrs. Alice Fletcher, all of Oklahoma*

*City, Okla. Services will be at 10 a. m. Wednesday at First Baptist Church, Camp Verde. Masonic graveside services will be at 1 p. m. at Citizens Cemetery, Flagstaff.*<sup>15</sup>

Stacy pursued a career as a bookkeeper and auditor. He worked for a number of traders and distributors including Hubert Richardson in Cameron,<sup>16</sup> Lorenzo Hubbell in Winslow, All American Distribution Company of Phoenix, Arizona,<sup>17</sup> and the Goodyear Tire and Rubber Company in San Francisco, California. Later he became an auditor for the State of Arizona in Phoenix. After retirement he moved to Camp Verde, north of Phoenix, where he lived for about twenty-five years.

*Stacy Hibben, 97, died March 9 [1983] at the home of his daughter, Annette Fitzgerald, in Phoenix. Private services were held Thursday, followed by burial in Flagstaff. Mr. Hibben was a longtime resident of Camp Verde, moving to the area early in 1958. . . Mr. Hibben was a widower. His wife, Edith, died in 1975. He is survived by his daughters, Mrs. Fitzgerald, and Adalynlee Payne of Tempe. Also surviving are his sister, Katherine Hart of Phoenix, seven grandchildren and 12 great-grandchildren.*<sup>18</sup>



Dennis Sullivan Hibben was born March 4, 1889 in St. Paul, Minnesota. (Plate 12) He was raised in Flagstaff, Arizona where he graduated from high school in 1903.<sup>19</sup> Six years later on June 6, 1909 he married Hazel Evelena Todd. Hazel had been born in Cadillac, Michigan in 1888.

*My mother always told me that Hazel, her mother, came out all alone on the train from Cadillac, MI to Arizona. Believe that Milton [Todd] probably sent her to live with friends, the Campbell family when beautiful Mina Evalena (Hazel's Mother) died at the young age of 21 or 22. . . Dennis Sullivan Hibben, my Grandfather that I knew well when I was a young man, told me many times that Milton Todd, Hazel's father was instrumental in the breakup as he didn't like Dennis, but I would love to talk to Milton, if he were still living, and find out his side of the story. I know that Dennis led a rather 'wild' life at times. I loved him a great deal and have fond memories of visiting him in Sacramento, CA at his small house on 21st. street. . . We would go out to his little woodshop, drink very stale coffee and talk of history and his love for Hazel that he swore never ended.*<sup>20</sup>

Dennis' and Hazel's children were Lynn Maxwell Hibben, born November 16, 1910 and Adeline Todd Hibben, born December 8, 1912. Lynn was killed while crop dusting when his airplane crashed June 25, 1948. Adeline married Verrill Amon Townsend, September 26, 1932 and died May 19, 1981.

Dennis served in the Expeditionary Force in France during WW I and survived a gas attack.<sup>21</sup> After Hazel and Dennis divorced, Dennis married Pearl Lenore Dickson on July 3, 1925. They had two daughters; Vivian Louise Hibben, born August 27, 1926 and Pearl Marie Hibben, born January 30, 1928. Pearl Lenore Dickson was born March 10, 1904 and died December 13, 1999 in Clark County, Washington.<sup>22</sup>

Dennis Sullivan Hibben died April 26, 1966 in Sacramento, Sacramento County, California.<sup>23</sup>

## THE THOMAS HIBBEN LINE



Harry Cobb Hibben, Jr. was born May 8, 1893 in Flagstaff, Arizona after his family's arrival from St. Paul, Minnesota. (Plate 12) He served in WW I as a Corporal in the Army<sup>24</sup> and as a young man he worked with his father as a sales clerk in the Lorenzo Hubbell store at Hollywood and Vine in California. Voting registration records indicate that during WWII Harry was an aircraft worker, but prior to and subsequently, he worked as a sales clerk.<sup>25</sup>

Addie (unknown) Dietzman appears as Mrs. Addie S. Hibben in these same records in 1940.<sup>26</sup> Addie, born September 21, 1883, was nine years older than Harry and at least fifty years old when they married. She had been married to Oscar Dietzman before 1912. The 1920 US Census records her with Oscar and a daughter, Dena age 8, living in Flagstaff, Coconino County, Arizona.<sup>27</sup> Census records also reveal that the Dietzman family had resided in Flagstaff before 1900. After their marriage, Addie and Harry lived over twenty years on Killian street in El Monte, California. Addie died October 14, 1963.<sup>28</sup> Harry moved to Phoenix, Arizona in 1967 where he died November 13, 1972.<sup>29</sup>

*Services and burial for Harry C. Hibben, 80, a World War I veteran who was born in Flagstaff, will be in Whittier, Calif. Mr. Hibben of 16005 N. 32nd St., who had been a sales clerk, died Monday in Phoenix Veterans Hospital. A member of American Legion post in El Monte, Calif., he came to Phoenix in 1967 from California. Survivors include two sisters, Mrs. Katherine H. Hart of Phoenix and Mrs. Milly Sparks of Flagstaff; and a brother, Stacy, of Camp Verde.*<sup>30</sup>

Adalynlee Hibben Payne, his niece, is in possession of a bible "*Presented in Loving Memory of Harry C. Hibben by American Legion El Monte [California] Post 261, November 16, 1972.*"



Kathrine Louise Hibben was the youngest of the children of Harry C. Hibben. (Plate 12) She was born September 27, 1904, twenty years after her sister, Milly. As previously noted,<sup>31</sup> she refused the guidance of her stepmother, and returned to Flagstaff to graduate from high school. She then attended business college in Los Angeles. She married David Edgar Hart<sup>32</sup> and lived at the Grand Canyon. They did not have children. He was known as Edgar and was a stationary engineer for the Santa Fe Railroad at the Grand Canyon power plant. Newspaper articles relate that he was an avid fisherman and hunter.

Kathrine's first job was at the Lowell Observatory where she was a typist and bookkeeper. Subsequently, she worked for many years for the Babbitt Brothers Trading Company<sup>33</sup> at the Grand Canyon. In 1964, upon the 75th anniversary of the company, she was awarded a bronze plaque, an outstanding service award for the best all round employee. When she retired after 25 years of service she was presented a Gorham silver tray with the engraved signatures of John G. Babbitt, J. R. Babbitt, Jr., J. D. Babbitt, Paul J. Babbitt, and R. T. Babbitt, Jr.

Edgar died in February 15, 1975.

*DAVID HART, 71 Phoenix-- David Edgar Hart, 71, former postmaster at the Grand Canyon, died Saturday in John C. Lincoln Hospital. Mr. Hart retired in*

1968 after five years as postmaster. He lived at 2650 W. Union Hills Dr. He was born Nov. 8, 1903 in Camp Verde, and was twice post master of the Williams-Grand Canyon Lodge 38 of the F&AM. He was a stationary engineer for 34 years with the Santa Fe Railroad. Services will be at 11 a. m. Tuesday in Lundberg's Sunland Chapel, Sun City. Burial will be private. Survivors include his widow, Kathrine; a brother, Fred W. and another brother out of state; a sister, Mrs. Marie Prochnow and three other sisters out of state.<sup>34</sup>

After Edgar's death, Kathrine moved to Phoenix to be near her nieces, Annette Hibben Fitzgerald and Adalynlee Hibben Payne, and Edgar's family. She died at the age of 94 in April of 1999.<sup>35</sup>

**Postscript: A Remarkable Three Generation Span**

Kathrine's death in 1999 occurred 205 years after the 1793 birth of her grandfather, Thomas Hibben.
