**JAMES ALLEN<sup>4</sup> HIBBEN** (*James<sup>3</sup>, Thomas<sup>2</sup>, John<sup>1</sup>*) was born June 15, 1823 in PA, and died 1889 in Blair, Washington Co., NE. He married (1) **ANGELINE STRONG** January 01, 1847 in Greene Co., OH. She was born Abt. 1828 in OH, and died bef. . He married (2) **ANNA M. MOORE** 1870, daughter of **JOHN MOORE** and **MARY** (unknown). She was born July 31, 1842 in Xenia, Greene Co., OH, and died February 05, 1900 in Xenia, Greene Co., OH.

**JAMES ALLEN HIBBEN 1823 - 1889**  
**and wives**  
**ANGELINE STRONG Abt. 1828 - Bef. 1870**  
**ANNA M. MOORE 1842 - 1900**

James Allen Hibben was the second child of James Hibben and Ann Watson Allison. He was born in Pennsylvania on June 15, 1823.<sup>1</sup> James was raised in Jamestown, Greene County, Ohio where he married Angeline Strong on January 1, 1847.<sup>2</sup> The Census of 1850 records that James and Angeline and two year old daughter, Alice, continued to live in Jamestown where he was employed as a carpenter.<sup>3</sup> Ten years later the family was recorded in Cedar County, Iowa and in 1870, at the age of forty-five, James was back in Jamestown, living with his parents. Daughter Alice had married and remained in Iowa, but Angeline was not recorded. It is assumed that Angeline had died. At that time James' occupation was listed as 'speculator,' and he had real estate holdings of \$10,000 and personal assets of \$1,000.<sup>4</sup> In 1870 after the census taker had recorded James in Jamestown, James married Anna M. Moore, probably in Xenia. For a period of years, they lived in Xenia where James was in the furniture business. James' father, James, died in 1871 and his mother, Ann, in 1875, terminating 'care giver' responsibilities in Jamestown. James and Anna then moved to Blair, Washington County, Nebraska, where James died in 1889. Anna then returned to Xenia and remained there until she died on February 5, 1900.<sup>5</sup>

**Additional Information About The Children Of James And Angeline**

Alice married Albert O. Pound in 1866 and they moved to Fairfield Township, Cedar County, Iowa. When the Census of 1870 was taken, Alice's first cousin, Richard Conkling Hibben, was living with Albert, Alice and their young daughters, Cora and Loua.<sup>6</sup> By 1880, two more daughters, Mary and Annie, had been born. Interestingly, the 1880 Census recorded James, but not Anna living with the Pound family in Iowa.<sup>7</sup>

The location and activities of this family after 1880 have not been found in Census data.
