#### **William And Addie Seslar Settle In Northern Wisconsin**

William Telfire Seslar was born June 19, 1862 in Bloomington, Clinton County, Ohio.<sup>1</sup> The 1870 Census records him at school in Bath Township, Allen County, Ohio.<sup>2</sup> After his father died he hired out to a nearby farmer, most likely to help support his mother and younger siblings.<sup>3</sup> In 1886 he married Sarah Adeline Angier, known as Addie, and had three children, Hattie, Nellie and William Grover Seslar.<sup>4</sup> All were born in Hammond, Lake County, Indiana. Both girls died at an early age. By 1900 William, Addie and son William had followed the other Seslar families west and were living in Alliance, Box Butte County, Nebraska, about forty miles north of Bridgeport.<sup>5</sup> Perhaps they found Sand Hills area of western Nebraska too bleak. In the 1910 Census and again in 1930 they were recorded living in Oneida County, Wisconsin where William and his son were farmers.<sup>6</sup> Addie died in 1934 and William in 1948.

#### **Additional Information About The Descendants Of William And Addie Seslar**

Census records reveal that William Grover Seslar and his wife Bertha had six children; Bertha H., Robert J., Homer J., Elaine M., Betty Ann, and Shirley M. Seslar. The first two were born in Illinois and the others in Wisconsin. In 1930 William's parents were living with his family and helping on the farm. William died January 12, 1965 in Tomahawk, Lincoln County, Wisconsin. No information has been found about his wife Bertha.

#### **Verona Supports Her Children After Charles' Death At An Early Age**

Charles Milton Seslar was born July 18, 1863 in Bloomington, Clinton County, Ohio.<sup>7</sup> He attended school in Bath Township, Allen County, Ohio.<sup>8</sup> In 1897 he married Helena Verona Yocher in Bloomington. After the death of an infant, they had two more children; Verona Agnes born May 10, 1899 in Camp Clarke, Morrill County, Nebraska and Thomas Matthew born November 16, 1901 in Standish Township, Arenac County, Michigan.<sup>9</sup> When his children were only a few years old, Charles died on March 30, 1904 at Bridgeport, Morrill County, Nebraska. He was buried at Forest Lawn Cemetery in Bridgeport.<sup>10</sup>

Helena supported her children, working as a seamstress. By 1910 the family had moved to Eureka, Lincoln County, Montana and by 1920 to Kendall, Multnomah County, Oregon.<sup>11</sup> Sometime between 1920 and 1930 she married Frank W. Sanders.<sup>12</sup> Helena lived into her ninetieth year and died November 11, 1958. She was buried in Evergreen Memorial Park, Seattle, King County, Washington.

### Additional Information About The Descendants Of Charles And Helena Seslar

Verona Agnes Seslar married Albert L. Endrizzi in about 1917. They had two sons; Albert C. Endrizzi born June 20, 1918, and Arthur Edwin Endrizzi born May 25, 1920.<sup>13</sup> The 1920 Census recorded that Verona's widowed mother and brother were living with the Endrizzi family.<sup>14</sup> Shortly after the 1930 Census was taken, Albert and Verona separated and she married Floyd Henderson. Thereafter both sons took the Henderson surname.<sup>15</sup> After Floyd died in January 1971,<sup>16</sup> Verona married again to William H. Tamm. He died in February 1980<sup>17</sup> and Verona lived to be ninety-four years old. She died in September 1993 in Enumclaw, King County, Washington.<sup>18</sup>

Thomas Mathew Seslar married Edith Amelia Fenn on June 2, 1928 in Hugo, Lincoln County, Colorado.<sup>19</sup> By 1930 they had moved to Portland, Oregon where Thomas was employed as a salesman for a baking company.<sup>20</sup> They had three sons, Charles William, Robert Thomas and Richard Budd Seslar. A member of his family recalls:

*Edith told Bob that Tom had disliked fishing, but took the boys often because he considered it something a father should do. Tom was a craftsman, and very deft with his hands. He was a superb carpenter, and the house on 39th showed many fine and unique design features. He loved to work with fine woods. His leather pieces, done mainly while he was ill, show great skill, a steady hand, and an eye for design. Toward the end of his life, Tom took an interest in family history, and wrote to distant relatives. He did not live to see the answers, but the replies form the basis for much of this work.<sup>21</sup>*

Thomas died December 7, 1965 in Seattle.<sup>22</sup> In June of 1987 Edith moved to a retirement community where she was very active.

*There will be more people in the expanded Ida Culver House than in the whole town in which I grew up," says Edith Seslar, an Ida Culver resident for more than two years and currently the president of our Residents Council. "I grew up in Rodman, Iowa, a small farming community of 90 people," comments Edith, known to friends as "Edie." "When the Ida Culver House fills up, there will be more than 100 residents- that's exciting!" From Rodman, Edie's family moved to Hugo, Colorado, another small farming community, where she graduated from high school. Edie and her late husband, Thomas, reared three sons, two of whom now live in Seattle; the other resides in Alaska. Edie was a homemaker while the children were in school, but went to work outside the home in the early 1940s. Her first job was with a shipbuilding firm, but she soon switched to the Golden Rule Bakery Company of Seattle as a sales manager. "I'm very good at sales," says Edie, with some modesty. In the '70s she became second vice president and then first vice president of the Retail Clerk's Union #1105. She retired five years ago. Her hobbies include sewing, gardening and reading. "I like to read anything*

*I can get my hands on," she emphasizes. Edie moved to the Ida Culver House in June of 1987, and in the two years since then has become an integral part of this community. "It's like a big family here," she says. "People are very friendly and I feel like I've known some all my life."<sup>23</sup>*

Edith was almost ninety when she died on July 31, 1998 in Federal Way, King County, Washington.<sup>24</sup>



### **Rosabelle Seslar Marries And Settles In Chicago**

Rosabelle Seslar was born on October 16, 1864<sup>25</sup> and her early years were spent in Bath Township, Allen County, Ohio. After the death of her father in 1877, her mother was unable to support her nine unmarried children. Rosabelle was sent to live with and be a servant of her second cousin, once removed, Cassius Aldridge and his wife Eliza.<sup>26</sup> Most likely Rosabelle moved with her mother to Chicago in about 1885 where she met and married John Broomfield on December 19, 1888.<sup>27</sup> John had emigrated from Canada in 1884.

The Census records indicate that John was employed in various positions as steamfitter, engineer and foreman in the Chicago stockyards from 1900 to 1930.<sup>28</sup> Rosabelle and John had five children: John Benjamin Broomfield, born January 20, 1891;<sup>29</sup> Ruth E. Broomfield, born April 25, 1897; Frederick William Broomfield, born in January 1899; Florence Belle Broomfield, born March 17, 1901; and Polly before 1910.<sup>30</sup> All are believed to have been born in Chicago, Illinois. Rosabelle died March 23, 1928 in Cook County, Illinois.<sup>31</sup> John had attained the age of eighty by the time he died on October 14, 1944 in Cook County.<sup>32</sup> Many photographs taken at a Broomfield/Enright reunion on July 4, 1942 capture a healthy and beaming grandfather.

### **Additional Information About The Descendants of Rosabelle and John Broomfield**

Childhood photographs identify John Benjamin Broomfield as Ben or Bennie Broomfield, a given name he was known as during his entire lifetime. Caroline Miller Seslar's journal written in Morrill County, Nebraska records the sad events of her husband's nephew Ben's first marriage and subsequent remarriage.

*A baby boy was born at Ben Broomfield's house . . .*

*Bennie Broomfield's wife died Dec. 20th 1910 . . .*

*Ben Broomfield's baby died Feb. 1911 . . .*

*A baby boy was born to Ben Broomfield May 17, 1912 by his second marriage, named Frederick . . .<sup>33</sup>*

Ben's second wife, Birdie Gaynell Everhart daughter of Charles Wesley Everhart and Charlotte Estella West, was born April 8, 1888 in Kansas City, Kansas.<sup>34</sup> They were married April 17, 1911, most likely, in Cook County, Illinois.<sup>35</sup> Son, Frederick LeRoy was born May 17 in 1912 in Chicago. Their second child, Floyd Jennings, was born June 9, 1916 in Potter, Wyandotte County, Kansas and died just three months later on September 9th. Tragedy struck again when Frederick LeRoy died on December 5th of the same year.<sup>36</sup> Sometime shortly thereafter Ben, who was employed as a locomotive fireman for the Santa Fe Railroad, was injured in a train collision. Damage to his hip resulted in a permanent limp and a 1917 World War I draft exemption.<sup>37</sup>

*There was a photo of two trains that had crashed head on that was not able to be saved out of mess that was Bob's mom's [Catherine Pierce Broomfield] shed. On that photo Birdie had written "Ben's train wreck". We know that Ben was crippled in one leg from a very bad train accident that sent him to the hospital for quite awhile.*<sup>38</sup>

Two more sons were born, Raymond Benjamin on November 9, 1917 and Richard William on September 23, 1920, both in Argentine, Wyandotte County, Kansas. Raymond died February 15, 1926 in Argentine at the age of nine.<sup>39</sup>

Ben died December 20, 1950 in Argentine and Birdie survived him by twenty nine years, dying April 17, 1979 in Simi Valley, Ventura County, California.<sup>40</sup>

Son Richard married Catherine Nadine Pierce on July 5, 1945.<sup>41</sup> They had four sons, three of whom are living as of 2009. Richard died August 7, 1987 in Mariposa, Mariposa County, California. Catherine died July 12, 2007 in Apple Valley, San Bernardino County, California.<sup>42</sup>

Ruth E. Broomfield was born April 25, 1897 in Chicago, Cook County, Illinois<sup>43</sup> and was married about 1917 to John J. Enright, born about 1894 in Iowa. John served during World War I as a Private in Company A, 25th Infantry, A.E.F. Siberia, U. S. Army. After the war John was employed as bridge construction laborer and milk route salesman.<sup>44</sup> Ruth and John had eight children; Jane Ann, Robert D., Roger F., Elizabeth R., John J., Jr., Kenneth D., Ruth Ellen and Delores Florence Enright. John's date and place of death are not known. Ruth died April 1, 1962 in Hammond, Lake County, Indiana.

*Mrs. Ruth E. Enright, mother of Mrs. Owen Shields of Erie. Mrs. Enright, sixty-four, of 17303 Burnham Ave., Lansing, died Sunday at St. Margaret's Hospital, Hammond, Ind. She had been hospitalized for three weeks with a heart ailment. She was the wife of John J. Enright. The former Ruth Broomfield, she was born April 25, 1897 in Chicago. Mrs. Enright spent much of her spare time in the interests of young people. She was youth counselor for several years at Ingleside Methodist Church, Chicago. Surviving besides her husband are four daughters, Elizabeth R., wife of the Rev. Owen W. Shields, pastor of Simpson Methodist Church, 21st and Sassafras; and Mrs. Orvis (Ruth Ellen) Wertz, Mrs. Marvin (Delores) Kelly and Mrs. Clifford (Jane) Jensen, all of Lansing. Also surviving are four sons, Robert D. Enright Jr., Roger F. Enright, Jack Enright Jr., of Hammond, and the Rev. Kenneth D. Enright, Methodist Missionary to The Congo, Africa. Further survivors include 32 grandchildren ranging in age from two months to twenty years. The Schrader Funeral Home, Lansing, is in charge of arrangements. Funeral services will be held there at 1 p.m. today with the Rev. Owen Baxter, of Lansing Bible Church officiating. Burial will be in Mt. Hope Cemetery, Chicago.*<sup>45</sup>

Frederick William Broomfield was the second son of Rosabelle and John Broomfield, born January 15, 1899 in Illinois.<sup>46</sup> On December 14, 1920, at the age of 21, he married Martha Wilhelmina Stelzer. At that time Frederick was employed as a fireman on a railroad and held this position for many years. In 1930 Frederick and Martha were living in Chicago with Frederick's widowed, sixty-six year old father and next door to his sister, Ruth, and her Enright family.<sup>47</sup>

They had four children, Vivian Zoe, Bernice Lois, John Charles and Frederick William Broomfield. Father Frederick died January 14, 1950 and Martha passed away in May 1974 in Omaha, Douglas County, Nebraska.<sup>48</sup>

Of these four children, only John is still living. Vivian, born April 14, 1922 in Chicago, Cook County, Illinois, married Charles Leo Hakl on August 17, 1947 in Chicago. They had three children. Vivian died January 30, 1989 in Downey, Los Angeles County, California<sup>49</sup> and Charles died September 2007 in Visalia, Tulare County, California.<sup>50</sup> Bernice, born December 19, 1923 in Chicago, married John Kaluzny about 1945 in Chicago. They had four children. Bernice died January 22, 1990 in Albuquerque, Bernalillo County, New Mexico.<sup>51</sup> The date and place of the death of John Kaluzny is unknown. Frederick was born August 12, 1932 in Chicago and died November 28, 1954 in Chicago.<sup>52</sup>

Florence Belle Broomfield was born March 17, 1901 in Illinois.<sup>53</sup> At the age of nineteen she was employed as a mail order clerk and living with her family in Hyde Park on Chicago's south side.<sup>54</sup> The same year, about 1920, she married Alvin Ernest Pooler. The 1930 Census reveals that the Pooler family was living in Hammond, Lake County, Indiana where Ernest was employed as a carpenter in a railroad car shop. Before that time Florence had given birth to Dorothy Laverne Pooler on March 19, 1921;<sup>55</sup> Maybelle Pooler on May 23, 1923;<sup>56</sup> and Ruth E. Gene Pooler in 1926.<sup>57</sup> They were followed by Alvin John George Pooler, born on March 21, 1930,<sup>58</sup> and Richard Lee Pooler, born on February 11, 1936.<sup>59</sup> Verbal information attributed to Ruth Pooler indicates that two other children died in infancy.

*Florence and Alvin Pooler had 5 children that survived past childhood. Florence had one son that passed away at a very young age from what they thought was smallpox. My grandmother said he had large boils on his skin. She also had a little girl who passed away from food poisoning. The story goes that my grandmother and her family were very poor during the depression and following his death [in 1935 at the age of forty-eight from lingering illness resulting from mustard gas poisoning while serving in Europe during WW I]. They received some food from the government including "blocks of cheese," "beans" and one time they received a chicken. However, upon Florence opening the wrappings of the chicken, she realized it was spoiled and wrapped it back up and set on the back of the kitchen counter to take back to the government food place to exchange it for another one the next day. Because they went without that night, the little girl who was approx. four years old at the time, woke up in the middle of the night and was so hungry she climbed on he counter and ate some of the chicken. She died due to complications of ingesting the chicken.<sup>60</sup>*

Florence died May 4, 1951 and all of her children, except Ruth Pooler Leugoud, are deceased.<sup>61</sup>
